- **Be aware of your own personal health.** If you show any of the Covid-19 symptoms you must stay at home, inform NHS Test and Trace and seek medical advice.
- **Be responsible.** Read the guidance provided by The FA and by your club so that you are aware of the changes to the game and what is expected of you. This will include things like being prepared to wash your own kit, bringing your own labelled water bottle and being aware of changes to meet-up times.
- Practise good hygiene. Wash your hands regularly and before, during and after a game.
- Where possible maintain social distancing. This won't always be possible in a competitive match environment (for example when tackling an opponent) and that is acceptable. However, before, and after a game you should maintain social distancing.
- **Support NHS Test and Trace.** You're likely to be asked to provide your details so that in the event of a Covid-19 outbreak those potentially infected can be traced. This is to everyone's benefit so please co-operate.
- **Do not spit.** Spitting and the rinsing out of mouths is now a recognised risk to health and must not be done. Avoid shouting or raising your voice if face to face with other players.
- **After the game.** Be aware that other users may be waiting to use the facilities. Changing rooms and showers are likely to be closed and any socialising must follow the **Government's guidance** on social distancing.

Entry

Parking

Parking Marshalls will be on hand to ensure social distancing when entering and exiting vehicles along with stewards. Parking Marshalls will direct spectators to the appropriate turnstiles/.

Turnstilles

Social distancing is to be maintained when queuing for entry to the stadium, markings and barriers are in place to ensure effective social distancing

Staff operating turnstiles will be given appropriate PPE

Supporters are requested to wash hands using handwashing stations upon entry to the stadium.

Stands

At present supporters will only be permitted into the Wimblebury terrace, Hednesford end and Heath Hayes end of the stadium. The main stand will be used for additional space for substitutes and officials from both home and visiting sides.

BAR AREAS

Bar areas are to be socially distanced and will be monitored for numbers continuously. A queuing system will be in place along with a one way traffic system.

Dressing Rooms

Divide teams into two groups for each team to change and shower Maximum of 6 at any one time Only Physio's allowed in the dressing rooms

No team talks in dressing rooms.

After the Game

Payment of match officials electronically if possible Bar will be open

Sign In - Staff, Match Officials, Players, Committee, Football Management both teams and spectators with names, addresses and mobile numbers.

Thermometer check on entry for all Clubs to provide a list before each match, tick sheet for quick entry

Maximum spectators will be limited to 300 No programmes will be available at this time

Follow all signage either directional or information
